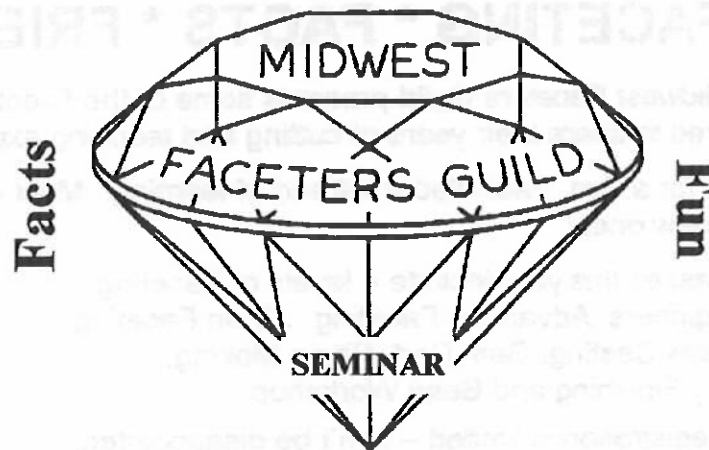

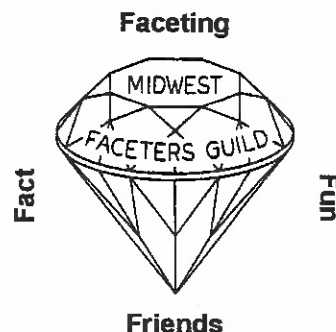

## Seminar 2000 Class Descriptions

### CLASS ONE

#### **Beginners I**

Faceting One is for the new cutter. Students will learn about the faceting machine and the basic steps necessary to cut and polish a simple Beginners Brilliant gemstone. This session will have a limited number of machines available on a first come, first served basis. Students who have their own machines and laps are requested to bring them. This class will be limited to six students. More students may be accommodated if enough instructors are available. The cutting material will be furnished for this class.

### CLASS TWO

#### **Beginners II**

Faceting Two is for the Novice cutter who has knowledge of faceting and the faceting machine. Students will learn more advanced faceting procedures while cutting the Commercial Brilliant. Students will bring their own machines and laps. This class will be limited to six students. More students may be accommodated if enough instructors are available.

Please bring 1-3 pieces of rough (natural and/or man-made) gem material, dopped and ready to begin cutting. If possible, preform these pieces into rounds, with the pavilion preformed at 45°.

### CLASS THREE

#### **Beginners III**

Faceting Three is for the more advanced cutter. Students will learn the techniques for cutting the Standard Round Brilliant. Students will bring their own machines and laps. This class will be limited to six students. More students may be accommodated if enough instructors are available.

Please bring 1-3 pieces of rough (natural and/or man-made) gemstone material, dopped and ready to begin cutting. If possible, preform these pieces into rounds, with the pavilion preformed at 45°.

### CLASS FOUR

#### **Beginners IV**

Faceting Four is for the Intermediate cutter. This session will cut an Oval. Students will bring their own machines and laps. This class will be limited to six students. More students may be accommodated if enough instructors are available.

Please bring 1-3 pieces of rough (natural and/or man-made) gemstone material, dopped and ready to begin cutting. Do not preform this rough. This rough should be of a size large enough to cut an 8 X 10 mm or 10 X 12 mm, or similarly metered size gemstone. **Do NOT** preform this rough.

### CLASS FIVE

#### **Advanced Faceting**

Faceting Five is for the Advanced cutter. This session will cut a "fancy type" (emerald cut or marquise) gemstone using the CAM (Centerpoint Angle Method) or the meet point method of cutting a fancy without the use of the offset head.

**Bring your own machine and laps.**

Please bring 1-3 pieces of rough (natural and/or man-made) gemstone material, dopped and ready to begin cutting. Do not preform this rough. This rough should be of a size large enough to cut an 8 X 10 mm or 10 X 12 mm, or similarly metered size gemstone. **Do NOT** preform this rough.

### CLASS SIX

#### **Open Faceting**

Faceting Six is for the Intermediate to Advanced cutter. This session will be "Open Faceting". The cutting of Natural Gem Stones may be included in this class. Students should bring their choice of gemstones and diagrams to cut. Instructors will be available to help you work through any difficulties.

**Bring your machine, laps, gemstones and diagrams.**

**Share the fun and fellowship of friends cutting and learning together.**

## Seminar 2000 Class Descriptions

### CLASS SEVEN

#### Gem Cad

Faceting Seven is for the faceter who wants to create his/her own designs using the GEMCAD computer program. This will be a "hands on" computer session. The Mott Community College Computer Lab is available for our use.

Students can expect to 'copy' a design utilizing symmetry with/without mirror image; establish length-to-width ratios using appropriate indexing and symmetry; design by eye from graphics using the listed numbers as a guide; customize the design for materials; correct any errors; analyze for brilliance faceup and tilted; then 're-correct' for the near maximum brilliance coordinating the pavilion and crown angles.

If you have a computer you may bring it along.

### CLASS EIGHT

#### Lost Wax Steam Casting

Class Eight will teach the basics of lost wax steam casting. This will be a "hands on" session including how to modify and size waxes, invest and steam cast a ring or pendant.

Students may bring their own round gemstones and may bring their own old gold for re-use.

Class material fee \$10.00, plus metal for your casting.  
Rings average 3-10 grams.

14K yellow gold \$10.00 per gram.

Sterling Silver \$0.50 per gram.

Metal prices subject to current market prices.

### CLASS NINE

#### Jewelry Finishing

Class Nine will be Jewelry Finishing where the student will be introduced to **basic finishing techniques**. Students will be using such aids as the flex shaft and a polishing unit. If students have any castings to finish, they may bring them. If stones need to be set, bring you own. This course will also introduce the student to the basic steps of prong setting for faceted stones and bezel setting for cabochons. This part of the class is a demonstration and is not a hands on situation.

### CLASS TEN

#### Bead Workshop

Class Ten will be a Bead Workshop. The Workshop will be divided into two parts; Gemstone and Pearl Beading taught by Diane Kuzara or Seed Bead weaving taught by Jacquie Swain and Mae Becker. You may take either two day workshop, you choose! You may bring your own beads & findings, purchase them from the instructors or from A&B Jewels & Tools at the Seminar. Patterns, needles and thread will be supplied.

If you are a beginner you will need to bring:

- \* A small towel to work on
- \* Chain nose pliers
- \* Round nose pliers (if you have them)
- \* Cutters
- \* Small sharp embroidery scissors
- \* Clear nail polish (cheap)
- \* Container for tools and supplies

### CLASS ELEVEN

#### Chain Making

Class Eleven will be Chain Making. Students will learn how to wind wire on a mandril and cut the wound wire into jump rings. Using jump rings and two pairs of pliers you will assemble a bracelet called "Kings Link". This style of chain is also called the Byzantine Chain or Idiots Delight.

(and if you stay in class longer Sunday or begin earlier, the cost per hour drops even more).

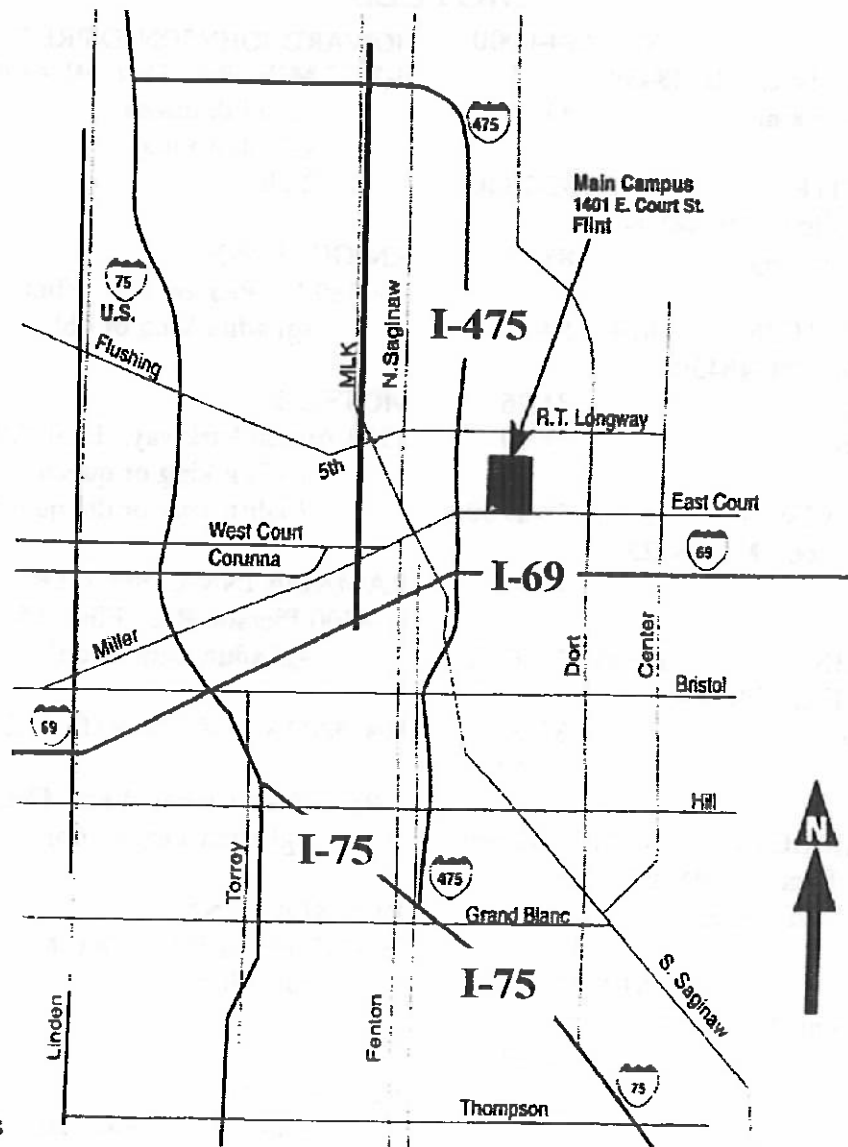

#### I-75 (From the South via I-475)

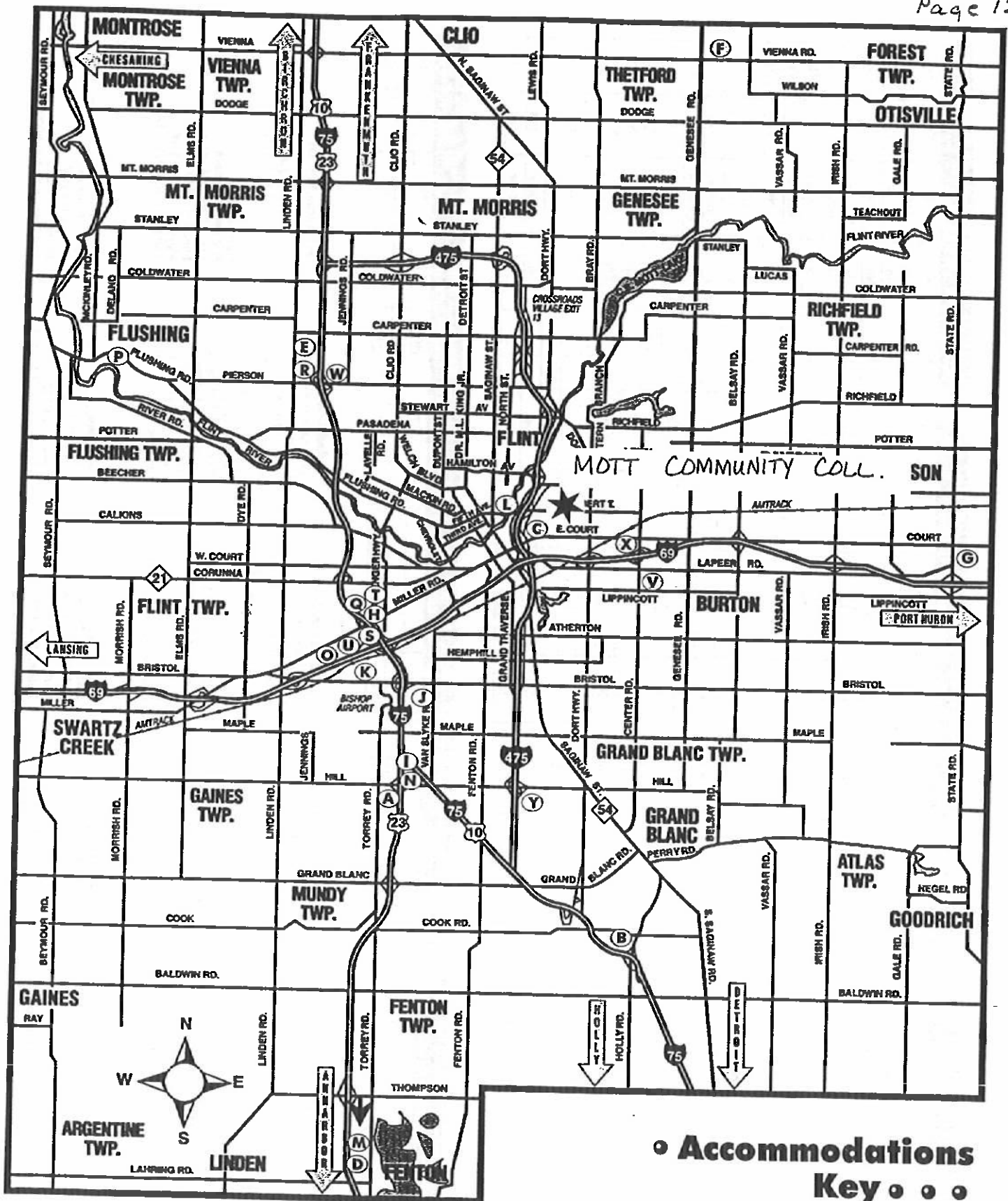
