FACETERS GLOSSARY

Boule: A pear or carrot shaped mass that forms during the production of some synthetics; literally means "ball," since the early ones had a crude spherical shape. Refers to flame fusion and pulling gem products.

Brilliancy: Total amount of white light returned to the eye from a gem material as a result of internal and external reflections. The major factors that affect the amount of brilliance in a gem are: refractive index, proportions, polish and transparency.

Carat: A unit of weight for gems, equal to 200 milligrams.

Change of color: A phenomenon of some colored stones in which the gem material appears a different color in incandescent light than in daylight or fluorescent light; caused by selective absorption and transmission.

Cleavage: A smooth, flat break in a direction parallel to a plane of atoms in a crystalline mineral.

Color zoning: Uneven color distribution in gem materials, appearing as irregular patches of varying colors or different tones of the same color.

Colored stone: A gemstone of any species other than diamond. This usage arbitrarily classifies all varieties of such species as colored stones, including colorless varieties, but it does not include colored diamonds; however, it has proved a practicable and satisfactory classification.

Cutlet: The small facet polished across what would otherwise be the sharp point or ridge on the pavilion of a faceted stone, especially one which is brilliant cut; placed with the sole intention of retarding breakage.

Gemology: The study of gemstones, to include the study of their identification, grading and appraisal as well as the examination of their symbols, fashioning and marketing.

Loupe-visible: Visible with the aid of a loupe. (In gemology, usually refers to a 10x loupe.)

Mixed cut: A combination of brilliant cut above the girdle and step-cut below; often used in colored stones to improve color and brilliancy.

Hardness: The resistance to scratching.

A CRYSTAL

A crystal is one of the strangest objects in nature. It is not alive yet it grows. A crystal attracts the same kind of materials of which it is composed, arranges them with great accuracy in geometrical forms, cements the parts together and holds them. Place a crystal in a liquid or vapor composed of the same ingredients as the crystal, and the process of accumulation immediately begins. If a crystal be broken in two parts and placed in a bath of liquefied crystals, the broken surface will be repaired and each part will grow into another crystal, providing other conditions favorable for crystal growth are present.

Even after a crystal has been worn until it is but a rounded grain of sand, it will speedily become a crystal again if placed in a solution containing the ingredients of which it is composed. There is no known limit to the ability of a crystal to repair itself and resume growth.

Under a microscope a crystalline solution can be seen forming into crystals, and it is a wonderful sight. First, innumerable dark spots form in the fluid, they stand still then they begin to move.

It is seen that movement arranges the spots in straight lines, like beads. The beads speedily coalesce into rods and the rods arrange themselves into layers until the crystal is created.

The process proceeds so rapidly that it is almost impossible to follow it closely.

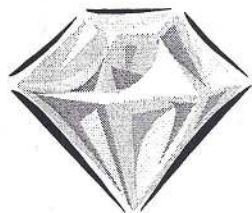
